Oba Shiroyama Park

Oba-Shiroyama has a wide open grass area with flowers and children's playground. It's a popular spot for Hanami (flower-viewing) of various cherry blossoms in spring.



Kodai-jingu (Shrine)
2-11-5 Kugenuma-Shinmei TEL 0466-24-5590
On August 17th, there's a festival of NINGYO-DASHI and YUBANA-KAGURA. NINGYO-DASHI are 8-meter-high, three-story wagons with HAFU-style roofs with lanterns and dolls on top of them. They go around town with HAYASHI (live music of Japanese drums and flutes). You can enjoy nine dolls of famous historical figures, including Yoritomo Minamoto (the first Kamakura Period Shogun), Ieyasu Tokugawa (the first Edo Period Shogun), and so on.



Nagakubo Park

In the Greenery Promotion Center, there is a maze made of a variety of hedge samples, a flower promenade, a stream plaza and a viewing plaza where you can see Enoshima.



Shonandai Bunka (Culture) Center

In Kodomo-Kan, children can experience many interesting activities including a planetarium and ethnic costume corner. Shimin Theater is a unique ball-shaped theater that is 24 meters high with a changeable stage.



Shirahata-jinja (Shrine)

Yoshitsune (younger brother of the Kamakura Shogun, Yoritomo Minamoto) had his head thrown away at Koshigoe after its identification. It is said that the head was scooped up and buried by the merciful local people and enshrined at the Shirahata-jinja. Near the shrine is a well where his head was washed.



Yugo-ji (Temple)

The head temple of Ji Sect, Yugo-ji was selected as one of the top 100 tourism spots in Japan. Ippen-Shonin started Ji Sect during the Kamakura Period as one of the Nenbutsu-Mons, and later, Donkai-Shonin IV built the temple. Walk up the 48 steps of Iroha-Zaka and you will find many historic spots and cultural assets in the wide open grounds, including Homotsu-Kan (treasure room).



Shinbayashi Park

Close to the city's center, this park lies in a green valley and is loved by bird watchers. A thatched-roof house of the Edo period (1603-1867), which had been dismantled at one time, then transferred and rebuilt, is now used for tea ceremonies.
